Regulation writers, editors, and publishers; administrative rule reviewers; and legal counsel involved with the regulatory process round out today's membership.

MODEL ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT

The Virginia Administrative Process Act, located in Title 2.2 of the Code of Virginia, is the statute that state government agencies must follow when creating, amending, or repealing regulations in Virginia.

The National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws is currently working on a draft Model State Administrative Procedures Act (MSAPA). The drafting committee began working on the draft MSAPA in 2004 and recently received an extension to continue its work for another year. 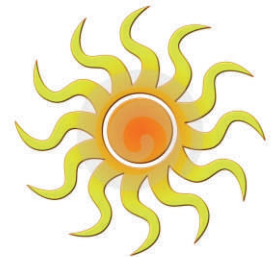

Richard also enjoys attending theater productions and traveling with his wife, Beverly, and spending time with his two sons, stepson, stepdaughter, and four grandchildren.

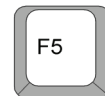


For the Night Owls ...

If you plan to use RIS in the wee hours of the morning, note that the **system is unavailable** between 4 a.m. and 5 a.m. daily and between 4 a.m. and 8 a.m. on Thursdays for backups and system maintenance. Be sure to save your work BEFORE the system goes down at 4 a.m.

Have you ever been frustrated by making changes to a section in an RIS project, then pressing the "RIS Update" button on your RIS toolbar and NOTHING HAPPENS? **Don't Panic**--you probably need to refresh your screen. Press the F5 button on your keyboard and your changes will appear.
